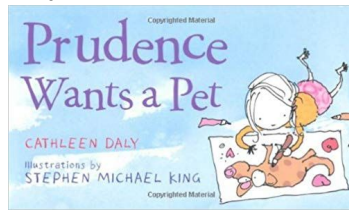

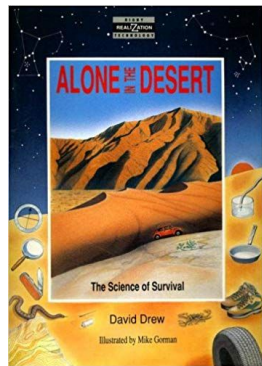
“Prudence Wants a Pet”

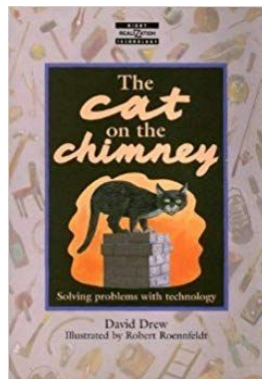
“Alone in the Desert: The Science of Survival”

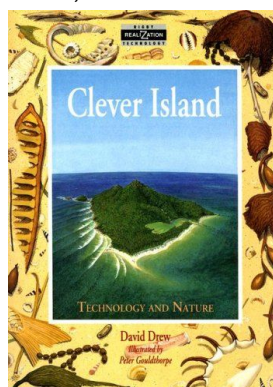
“The Cat on the Chimney: Solving Problems with Technology”

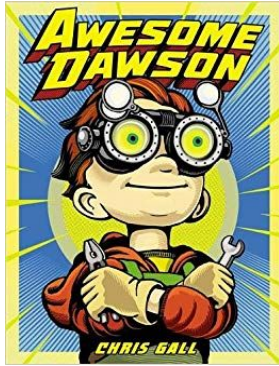
“Clever Island: Technology and Nature”

Gail, Chris

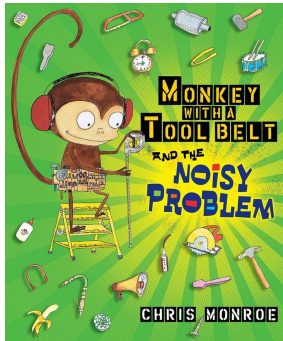
