


# Book Club Buffet!

5 Book Clubs, one Dinner!


- Choose a book from an assortment of titles

Where: Curriculum Annex, behind Board Office (3143 Jacklin Road)




“Mathematical Mindsets” by Jo Boaler draws on Jo’s extensive research with thousands of students as a professor of math education at Stanford. Filled with illustrative examples, she guides us to transform children’s ideas and experiences of math through a positive growth mindset.



“Making Thinking Visible” by Ritchhart, Church & Morrison helps us transform our classrooms into places where learning is viewed in the development of individuals who can think, plan, create, question, and engage independently as learners. This book offers research-based solutions for creating just such cultures of thinking.



“Students at the Center” by Kallick and Zmuda The authors state: “Educators’ most important work is to help students develop the intellectual and social strength of character necessary to live well in the world.” Kallick and Zmuda map out a model of personalization that puts students at the center and asks them to employ the set of dispositions for engagement and learning known as the Habits of Mind.



“Power of Inquiry” by Kate Murdoch asks: “How can we create learning environments that cultivate curiosity and grow young people as confident, capable and creative inquirers?” This book is an inspiring and comprehensive guide to the implementation of quality inquiry practices in the elementary classroom.
